River Trip (Boroughbridge – York)

Saturday 9th – Sunday 10th May



WHEN AND WHERE: Cleveland Scouts Watersport are running a two day river trip in canoes for Explorers from Saturday 9th until Sunday 10th May 2026. We will be staying overnight at Linton Lock Inn campsite.

COST: The cost per young person is **£25.00**. We won't be collecting payment until the week before in case we don't reach the minimum number of people we need or the weather prevents us from running the river trip.

ACTIVITIES: Two day canoe expedition on the River Ure/Ouse.

- Day 1 (16.3km):
 - **Start:** Boroughbridge River Parking, YO51 9BP
 - **End:** Linton Lock Inn Campsite, Linton-on-Ouse, YO30 2AZ
- Day 2 (15.5km):
 - **Start:** Linton Lock Inn Campsite, Linton-on-Ouse, YO30 2AZ
 - **End:** Marygate Car Park, York, YO30 7DT

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION: We will be running a two training session focused purely on the skills required for this trip on Saturday 18th April (12:45-16:15) and Friday 1st May (18:00-21:00). Anyone who wishes to do the river trip will need to attend both sessions. Please note due to the number of seats in canoes there is a maximum of 12 spaces on this trip. Spaces will be given on a first come first served basis.

All activities will be run in accordance with The Scout Association's safety rules. NO responsibility for personal equipment, clothing and effects can be accepted by the organisers and The Scout Association DOES NOT provide automatic insurance cover in respect of such items. Please contact the Leader if you require any further information.

IMPORTANT: Parent(s)/Guardian(s) are asked to complete the attached Permission to Camp Form by answering ALL questions and supplying full and frank information concerning their son/daughter. Please note that Explorers / Young Leaders will NOT be allowed to attend camp without a completed PTCF having been received by the Camp Leader.

The Permission to Camp Form must be received by no later than 10th April 2026.

- Mobile phones can be taken on the water but we strongly suggest purchasing a waterproof case. However this is at the young person's own risk.
- Showers are available at the campsite but require a 50p.

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
